Eliminating housing related hazards provides an opportunity to address an important social determinant of health."

Your Expertise is needed for Developing Product Safety Standards



Would you like to have an influence on the safety of products you use? Each year new products or product safety issues emerge, and these products require new standards for safety.

HERA member JoAnn Emmel has been involved in standards work for the U.S. National Committee of the IEC for years. One initiative of the USNC is to involve more consumer representatives on their Technical Advisory Committees (TAGS) that review international standards for electrical devices. Many of the committees use the internet for review and comment on proposed changes to standards so travel is typically not required.

William J. "Bill" Angell - Professor and Extension Specialist in Housing at the University of Minnesota - Member since 1971

Bill's responsibilities include serving as Director of the Midwest Universities Radon Consortium, a U.S. Environmental Protection Agency co-found Regional Radon Training Center. He teaches and coordinates about 30 courses annually in the North Central Region and Canada. He is also the immediate Past President of the American Association of Radon Scientists and Technologists. Bill is the Chair of the World Health Organization's International Radon Project's Prevention and Mitigation Working Group and he served as a co-editor of the *WHO Handbook on Radon: A Public Health Perspective*. He has been awarded a semester leave to develop a global framework on housing types and construction practices that influence radon entry, prevention, and mitigation. 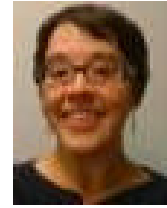
